## Bill Paying:

Utility bills are due on the 10th of the month. If the 10th falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or City observed holiday, the due date becomes the next business day. If not paid on or before the due date, the bill will incur a penalty charge of 10%. If an account is delinquent, service will be disconnected after 10:00 am on the last Tuesday of the month.

## Disconnect Fees:

If you have been disconnected for non-payment, the following are the applicable fees:

- \$100.00 for Disconnection
- \$100.00 for Reconnection outside regular business hours (in addition to the Disconnect Fee)



## Reminders

### Budget Billing:

- The City of Minden has re-evaluated the Utility Billing Budget amounts. The new budget amounts will be reflected on this Utility Bill due in August through July 2025. If you have questions about your new budget amount or would like to sign up, please contact City Hall.

### Mosquito Prevention:

- You can help keep the mosquito population down by removing any mosquito habitats. Some ways to help eliminate habitats are as followed: eliminating standing water in gutters, tires, buckets, plastic covers and toys; empty and change water in bird baths, fountains, wading pools, rain barrels and potted plant trays at least once a week.



### Lead Service Line:

- City employees will be going around town to take an inventory of water service lines for those that have not previously filled out a survey or have marked unknown. If you have marked lead, they may stop to make sure this is correct. This inventory of service lines is a Federal requirement. If you have not done so, the survey can be completed on the City website or by scanning the QR Code.



### Building Permits:

- The City would like to remind residents that building permits need to be approved before projects are started. Please allow a minimum of 2 weeks for permit processing before starting. For a complete list of projects that require building permits, please see the building permit application at City Hall (325 N Colorado) or on the City website.

### Hydrant Flushing:


- The City of Minden has begun its annual flushing of fire hydrants. This process does stir up sediment and may cause temporary discoloration of your water. Running your faucets will reduce the discoloration while the sediment moves through the water system.

### Water Restrictions:

- The City in NOT currently restricting water, however the water restrictions are listed below:
- Stage 1: Water Watch
  - Reduce weekly water consumption by 7%
- Stage 2: Water Warning
  - Reduce weekly water consumptions by 15%
  - Staggered Lawn Watering
    - Even Number homes water on Even Days
    - Odd Number homes water on Odd Days
    - Lawn Watering is restricted between 11am & 7pm
- Stage 3: Water Emergency
  - Reduce weekly watering consumption by 25%
  - Outdoor watering prohibited
- Municipal Code:
  - Sec. 86-190
